Village Mediator Trainers Reaffirm Commitment to Community Justice

With support from the EUROPEAN UNION and UNICEF through CHILUNGAMO II PROGRAMME, PASI convened a meeting with village Mediator Trainers at its new Office in Mangochi to introduce an upcoming project and strengthen collaboration with community based mediators.

During the meeting, participants were briefed on the vision and objectives of the project and were encouraged to continue playing their vital role in promoting access to justice. The mediators were reminded that they remain a key pillar in community justice delivery and were urged to also prioritize Gender-Based Violence (GBV) cases by referring them to the appropriate authorities for proper handling.

The meeting acknowledged the dedication and resilience of the village Mediator Trainers and the mediators for carrying forward the vision of PASI and continuing to provide support to vulnerable community members.

During this phase, the mediators will re-align their working relationships with the traditional leaders to ensure that access to justice among the rural communities is enhanced.

The meeting concluded on a positive and encouraging note, with the mediators affirming their commitment to continue working diligently in their communities to ensure that more people have access to justice and peaceful dispute resolution.

PASI is implementing a 44 months access to justice project under Chilungamo II Programme. The European Union through UNICEF is funding the project.
